Taro Yamashita's *Growing Up in a Mountainous Kindergarten*, the second publication in the Future of Children series, is now on sale.

After a long period of teaching college students, the author became convinced that early childhood experience is the foundation of all learning. He became a kindergarten principal to share his professional *philosophia* among children and adults, and began making a series of discoveries into the roots of children's happiness.

In the term *philosophia*, *philo* means love, and *sophia* means knowledge. Philosophers from all ages and cultures who embody this spirit appear in the book, guiding you through their maxims to reach a better understanding of the children in your life, with an even stronger sense of love.
